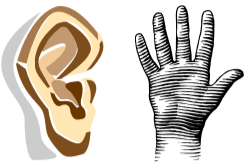




Revision Techniques



Mnemonics

If you have a group of keywords to learn, take the first letter of each word and form a mnemonic. The sillier the better as long as you can recall it!

K I N G D O M	P H Y L U M	C L A S S	O R D E R	F A M I L Y	G E N U S	S P E C I E S



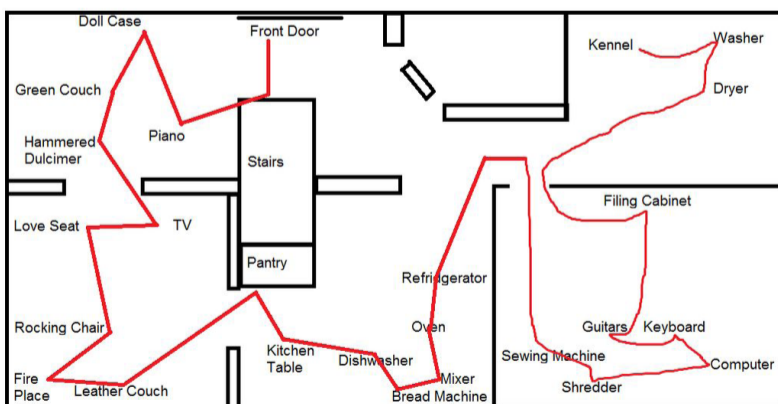
Rhymes & Songs

Helps you to remember knowledge in sequence. You learn it by repetition. You could record them and listen to them over and over.



Create a Memory Journey

Use an established journey e.g. to school, round your house. Associate landmarks/places with items you need to remember. This will 'anchor' them in your brain and all you will have to do is visualise that journey to recall the information.



Q&A Cards

Use post it notes, or index cards. Write the question on one side and the answer on the other. Lay all the cards on your table (question side up), and test yourself one at a time. If you get the answer correct, leave the card answer side up. If incorrect, leave it question side up, so that you can test yourself later.

Once you have completed the process, reverse the process. Leave the cards answer side up, and see if you can remember what the question was.



Spelling & Grammar

Spelling and grammar will be awarded marks. Practise the key words from your subject and make sure that as you revise, you learn to spell these words as well.
